

The Lord's Prayer 'Lord, teach us how to pray' W/C 10th May 2020

The disciples went to Jesus with a request, "Lord, teach us how to pray". Of course, they knew about prayer, they would've been taught how to pray as children, and perhaps even gone to a synagogue now and again, but they saw a dynamic in the life of their Lord that revealed something lacking in the prayers that they were familiar with.

We know that we could do better when it comes to prayer, but have we ever considered that behind our willingness, or ability to pray, is lack of appreciation of prayer itself?

Jesus responded to the request of his disciples by teaching them the Lord's prayer. This prayer serves both as a model (prototype) and a map (guide) on how to pray. Over next few we will be learning about prayer, not just so that we might know more, but that we might pray more.
